Special Screening & A Rebel's Outcry Book Talk

On Feb. 19th, The Little Tokyo Historical Society (LTHS) presented a special screening of the short film 'Lil Tokyo Reporter, in conjunction with panel discussion for the book "A Rebel's Outcry" at the Long Beach Japanese Cultural Center (LBJCC). The LBJCC was honored to be able to support the event at the Center, as well as welcoming their panelists which included Actress Keiko Agena, Filmmaker/Publisher Jeffrey Gee Chin and artist Takashi Uchida.

As Feb. 19th marks the Day of Remembrance for Japanese Americans, it was fitting to be able to acknowledge and celebrate the efforts of Civil Rights Leader Sei Fujii through the stories that were carefully put together by the LTHS group for "A Rebel's Outcry".

A Rebel's Outcry: Biography of Issei Civil Rights Leader Sei Fujii (1882-1954) is an illustrated biography and detailed look into the life of Japanese American civil rights leader Sei Fujii, known for overturning the California Alien Land Law in 1952 and founding

the Japanese American newspaper Kashu Mainichi (California Daily News). His complex history reveals his intriguing journey as an immigrant, a social justice activist, unionizer, and a community leader. Fujii's story exemplifies the multitude of ways Americans have and may continue to fight for our civil rights.

The official biography on Sei Fujii is the source material written by author Kenichi Sato and was commissioned by manager Junko Maruya of the Kashu Mainichi. Following the work by Sato, LTHS conducted over ten years of extensive research, including interviews with countless community members, Fujii's family, and visiting his ancestral samurai home in the Takamori Village of Iwakuni, Japan. Publication of this book is sponsored by Union Bank and UCLA Asian American Studies Center and the George and Sakaye Aratani Community Advancement Research Endowment.

2023 Kashiwabara Scholarship Awarded

The Kashiwabara Scholarship was awarded to Ryan Wataru Armantrout.

Ryan is a Long Beach Poly High School senior getting ready to graduate in June. He is in the PACE program at Poly.

He participated at the Long Beach Judo Dojo for 5 years, the Long Beach Japanese School for 13 years (winning the speech contest many times) and Long Beach Ondo, also for 13 years and counting.

He has applied to CSULB, Cal State Fullerton and Cal State Pomona wanting to get into their Engineering Programs.

Every applicant is required to submit a short essay on two topics: Cultural Center and an important person in your life. Below is the essay on the Center.

"I see the Long Beach Japanese Cultural Center as a hub for learning about and participating in different aspects of Japanese culture. You do not need to be ethnically Japanese to participate in anything at the Center, you just need a desire to learn about or participate in one of the aspects of Japanese culture offered at the Center. The Center strives to be multigenerational, with activities aimed toward many generations. Although the activities are multigenerational the leadership seems to only be the older generations. I would like to see younger people take more leadership roles at the Center. Internships for high school and college students could provide valuable and meaningful work experience for those interested in taking leadership positions in the community and provide the center with a new and fresh perspective. For example a social media intern could run a social media account to help with the dissemination of information about the Center".

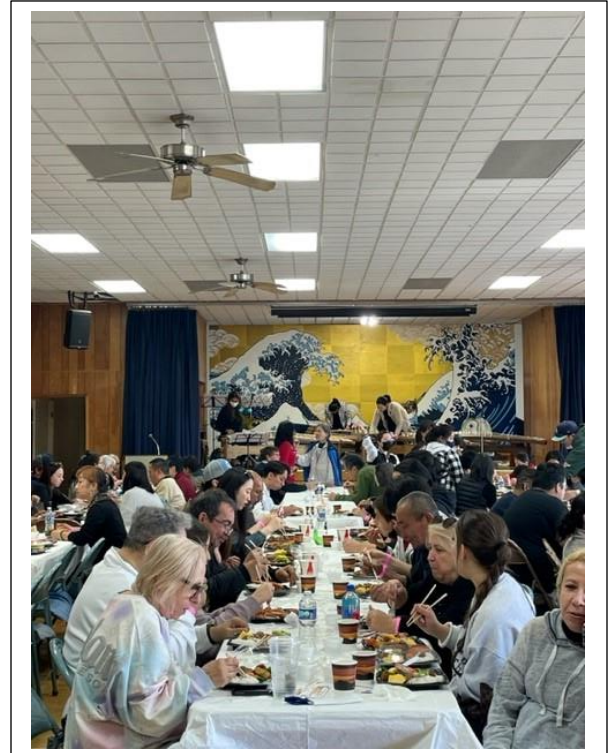

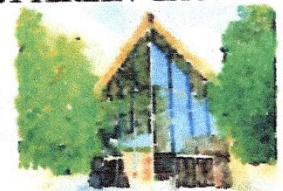
