After a three year hiatus due to the COVID-19 pandemic and extensive cleaning and reorganizing of facilities, the Long Beach Buddhist Church on Santa Fe Avenue in Long Beach resumed its semi-annual Chow Mein Dinner on Sunday, October 8, 2023.



Four generations of volunteer workers chipped in for over four days to help prepare the traditional ingredients for our famously tasty Chow Mein, cleaning, chopping, cutting, and cooking. Our senior members helped train the younger generations on exactly what it takes to make a proper Chow Mein, instructing how to correctly cut the thin vegetable slices, pickle the tsukemono, and fry up the egg and noodles just right. The assembly line of people packaging and bagging of orders and selling baked goods to go along with the main dish was quite well-organized, efficiently putting together over 700

orders in the three-hour pickup time window.

That was quite a lot considering that most of the advertising was simple word of mouth, and especially since it had been such a long time since the last sale. Those who bought were rewarded with an incredibly delicious meal, something our church has been renowned for over the years.

Because of the success of this sale and the overwhelmingly positive reviews, LBBC plans on continuing this semi-annual event with the next one in March.

## Terminal Islander's Win Heritage Award



On November 11th, the Long Beach Aquarium of the Pacific presented Terminal Islanders their Heritage Award at the 22nd Autumn Festival. Each year, the Autumn Festival highlights Asian traditions and cultures through learning opportunities and family entertainment. The Heritage award is presented to individuals or groups for their community service and leadership. The Terminal Islanders were recognized for their important legacy and commitment to sharing their history with others throughout generations.

Prior to WWII, Terminal Island was a fishing village in the Los Angeles Harbor. After Pearl Harbor and the incarceration of Japanese/Japanese Americans, the Terminal Islanders were scattered due to the complete destruction of their village. They stayed in touch with each other and in 1971 formed the Terminal Islander Club, a group that holds reunions each year. In 2002, the Terminal Island Japanese Fishing Village Memorial was dedicated to honor the original settlers and to preserve the memory, culture and history of their former home. Through the Terminal Islanders club, the next generation has continued to educate others on their legacy. 
