Persimmon Pudding

1/2 t baking soda 2 C persimmon pulp 11/2 C white sugar 2 eggs, beaten 2 C all purpose flour 2 t baking powder 1/2 t ground cinnamon 3/4 t vanilla extract Pinch salt 2 1/2 C milk 4 T melted butter

- -Preheat oven to 325 deg and grease a 9 x 13 pan
- -In mixing bowl combine persimmon pulp, baking soda, sugar and eggs. Mix well.
- -Add flour, baking powder, cinnamon, vanilla, salt, milk and melted butter. Stir to combine.
- -Pour into baking pan and bake in preheated oven for 55 minutes. Pudding will rise but will fall when removed from oven.

Serve with whipped cream or vanilla ice cream.

On Sunday, November 9, the church celebrated our 68th Anniversary followed by a Bento lunch to all attendees. After the luncheon, an Otakiage Ceremony was held which retired the Manto-e Obon Placards and other Buddhist articles that our families wanted to have respectfully and properly disposed of.





Oshogatsu お正月



Japanese New Year - Oshogatsu お正月 is an important holiday in Japan that has been celebrated on January 1st since 1873 due to Western influence, rather than following the lunar calendar.

There are many traditions associated with and leading up to this holiday. Kado Matsu-門松- is a traditional decoration made of pine and three bamboo stalks, cut diagonally in varying lengths. Pine boughs symbolize longevity, while bamboo stalks symbolize prosperity.

Another important traditional event leading up to the New Year is the Mochi Tsuki -餅つき. At this event glutinous rice is pounded with a wooden mallet while another person turns and wets the rice with a spatula to make mochi. The mochi is split and shaped in to small portions. After the mochi are made, some are set aside as offerings to the gods for good luck. This is called Kagami Mochi 鏡餅- two flat, round mochi placed on top of the other, with the lower mochi being slightly larger. Mochi is also enjoyed as part of the New Year's meal
